

The air show itself attracted a very big crowd, there were outstanding aerobatic displays; our representatives were made very welcome by the organisers; and quite a lot of visitors showed an interest in our display.

# Strange, but true

Last year one of our veteran members asked if we had any information on the Liberators that QANTAS operated after the war. Dave Miller has followed up on this and provided the following:

## AL 619 \*RAF Serial No.

BOAC Serial number: G-AGKT (no VH reg) went to QANTAS on 3 June 1944 and was scrapped at Mascot sometime after. It became a caravan then a hut for rabbits at Dungog, NSW.

### \*AL 547

BOAC serial number G-AGKU (no VH reg) went to QANTAS on 24 July 1944 and was scrapped at Mascot in June 1947.

## \*AL 524

BOAC serial number G-AGTJ then VH-EAJ for QANTAS on 28 April 1947 and was scrapped at Mascot in November 1950.

### \*AL 541

BOAC serial number G-AGTI then VH-EAI for QANTAS 26 June 1947 and was scrapped at Mascot in August 1950. It became a fish and chip shop in French's Forrest, Sydney.
